

Announcement-April 3, 2016

The Oglala Sioux Tribe and the Department of Veteran Affairs has made ending homelessness among Veterans a top priority, undertaking an unprecedented campaign to dramatically increase successful outcomes for Veterans and their families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

The ultimate goal is that all Veterans have permanent sustainable housing with access to high-quality health care and other supportive services and that homeless in the future is prevented whenever possible or is otherwise a rare, brief, and non-recurring experience.

The Oglala Sioux Tribe Veterans Shelter is a transitional housing program that is to promote the development and provision of supportive housing and/or supportive services with the goal of helping homeless Veterans achieve residential stability, increase their skill levels and/or income, and obtain greater self-determination.

The Oglala Sioux Tribe Veterans Shelter is now accepting applications for residence at the shelter. Many of our residents will be the achieving the goal of sustainable housing and the shelter anticipates having space for new residents.
