Well, to confirm what I told some of you, the MPA folks were greatly impressed with us — but a bit taken aback with the proposed budget (recall 75k/month), case of sticker shock.

I just met with Cregan to go over budget numbers. explained to him that 75/mo was our estimate of work needed to be done during the year — an average. In fact we envisioned 150k for each of the first two months and stower months to make it up (aug/nov/dec), we could bill them more earlier and less later as an alternative (particularly if we won during the first two months — then they would only need to make sure it stuck), also told him 100 for think tanks, up to 100 for PR and grass roots (again first 2 months), 100 for print ads — basically 2 month "crash" budget of 600, re pac — said 100k (which is what he had in mind) coupled with individual contributions (again he agreed). Soft money I said minimum 100k to get noticed, really needed 250k (per size). I think Jim understands and agrees and, all this — but does not have

also: I started with the point (and I don't think Jim had thought about this way but said he would use) about going from 15 to 9% saved them 100M — so that if they spend 1M+ on the effort that was a damn good ROI — much better than they could get elsewhre. realizing nothing is a sure thing, even a 50% prob. of success was still 50:1 — better than other ivnestments they could make.

finally, he posed the hypothetical what if the Board says "tell us what you can do for 50 a month?" I didn't engage — simply repeated that we, like them, wanted to win and wanted to fight with the resources needed to fight. Also he was wondering whether maybe they didn't have to do ads — I said couldn't tell until we were into it but at least had to have them ready. I think we could engage for less — but decided (with some advice) not to negotiate against ourselves at this point.

In early 1999, the Channel One Network faced a dire political situation: a fully engaged and highly metivated Left-Right political coalition explicitly dedicated to destroying the company. Channel One was playing catch-up, and in an all out advocacy effort developed a strategic plan with the law firm of Preston Gates to reverse the situation:

Waged All-Out Lobby Campaign

Immediately began program to contact and brief every Member of the Senate and House Education Committee, as well as key Committee and personal staff; bevelop confidential political intelligence indicating sneak attack via the Appropriations Committees; set in motion personal briefing sessions regarding Channel One with every Member and key staff of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees; Launched crash effort to innoculate the House and Senate leadership against anti-Channel One messaging. Channel One seized opportunity to televise Speaker Hastert's first day in office; Prepared briefing papers, talking points and background materials to provide constant stream of pro-Channel One information to all Members of Congress.

Seized control of Senate HELP Committee hearing.

In depth advocacy with both the House and Senate Education Committees; Organized trips with key education and leadership staffers to Channel One facilities in L.A. and to a Channel One school in Washington, D.C.; Recruited Committee champions: Senators Dewine (R-OH), Enzi (R-WY), Brownback (R-RS), Wellstone (D-NN), Collins (R-ME), Harkin (D-IA), and Voinovich (R-OH). Senator Sessions (R-AL) was persuaded not to join Senator Shelby's efforts; Recruited Father Weigand, principal of leading D.C. parochial Channel One school to counter anti-Channel One witnesses; Controlled agenda of May 20th hearing on Channel One despite Senator Shelby's active participation: pressured Committee to create multiple panels and prevented Committee from focusing solely on Channel One; Staged mock hearings to rehearse Channel One witnesses for both heatile and friendly questions; Created effective visuals for Committee hearing and press use and developed effective press kits; Pre-empted an attempt to develop a similar hearing in the House of Representatives.
