



Aquinnah Wampanoag Tribe Announces Chickasaw Nation As Gaming Development Partner

On Sunday August 19th, the Wampanoag Tribe of Gay Head (Aquinnah) announced the name of its gaming development partner at the Tribe's General Membership meeting. The Aquinnah Wampanoag Gaming Corporation has selected Chickasaw Nation's hospitality enterprise, Global Gaming Solutions, to assist them with developing their bingo facility on Martha's Vineyard.
