THE GRAND JURY CHARGES:

COUNT 1

On or about February 24, 2006, in the District of Arizona, within the confines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Indian Country, the defendant, ANDRE HINTON, an Indian, did intentionally, knowingly, and recklessly assault Jane Doe with a dangerous weapon, that is, a stove pipe and a stick, with intent to do bodily harm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1153 and 113(a)(3).

COUNT 2

On or about February 24, 2006, in the District of Arizona, within the confines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Indian Country, the defendant, ANDRE HINTON, an Indian, did intentionally, knowingly, and recklessly assault Jane Doe, resulting in serious bodily injury.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1153 and 113(a)(6).

COUNT 3

On or about February 24, 2006, in the District of Arizona, within the confines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Indian Country, the defendant, ANDRE HINTON, an Indian, did unlawfully seize, confine, kidnap, abduct, and/or carry away and hold for ransom or reward or otherwise Jane Doe, a child under the age of 18.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1153, 1201(a) and 1201(g).

COUNT 4

On or about April 30, 2005, in the District of Arizona, within the confines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Indian Country, the defendant, ANDRE HINTON, an Indian, did knowingly engage and attempt to engage in a sexual act with the victim, Jane Doe, a child who had attained the age of 12 years, but had not attained the age of 16 years, and who was at least four years younger than the defendant, by using force against her and by threatening or placing her in fear that she would be subjected to death, serious bodily injury and kidnapping. The sexual act involved contact between the defendant's penis and the victim's vulva.
