of our hard core tribes is being screwed by the BIA and we really need somehow to get to the Secretary to undo this fast. Their insurance business is just about to go under (days away) and BIA is just not responding since there is no new head there.

I have sent this to Steve as well, but I thought that perhaps you might be able to get this to the Secretary directly to get action. Here is the one pager on this:

Bureau of Indian Affairs Tribal Insurance Policy Putting Indian-Owned Insurance Companies Out of Business

Background

A November 15, 2000 memorandum (attached) issued by Jim Thomas, Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Office of Tribal Services, to the BIA Regional Directors regarding the purchase of insurance by tribal self-determination contractors unilaterally imposed a new requirement on said contractors to obtain insurance from a company licensed by the state in which the tribe is located.

Since the release of the memorandum, tribal self-determination contractors seeking to renew their insurance policies with Indian-owned insurance companies have been denied their requests by BIA regional offices because the Indian-owned companies are not licensed in the states in which tribes will purchase their services. The policy has also had a detrimental affect on the Indian-owned insurance companies who are being prohibited by the BIA from continuing to provide insurance services to existing tribal clients. If this anti-business policy is not revoked, it is only a matter of time before Indian-owned insurance companies are forced by the BIA to close their doors.

BIA Insurance Policy is Flawed and Should Be Revoked

The memorandum failed to take into account that many tribal self-determination contractors purchase their insurance from Indian-owned insurance companies due to these companies' unique understanding of tribal businesses and reservation economies, and the policy was issued independently by BIA bureaucrats without tribal consultation or input.

- Tribal self-determination contractors are not required by Federal statute in the Indian Self-Determination Act to obtain insurance from a company licensed by the state in which they reside. In addition, the new policy fails to address insurance companies that may have been organized pursuant to tribal law and/or Federal charter, which are not subject to state regulatory authority.

- The policy seeks to impose state regulatory law on Indian reservations, which is fundamentally at odds with established law as well as principles of self-determination.

Conclusion

The new BIA insurance policy severely limits the ability of tribes to select their own insurance carriers and is having a detrimental impact on tribal economic development efforts, both on tribes operating their own insurance companies who are offering proven, cost-effective coverage to other tribes nationwide and the tribal businesses who rely on these services.

The best solution is to rescind the policy in its entirety, but at a minimum, it should be modified to clarify that the requirements of state licensing have no application to an Indian-owned insurance company.

I just found out why the opponents of the CNMI and Speaker Ben Fitial did all they could to kill his visit with Secretary Norton.

As you recall, Ben is running for Governor. Although he is the former chairman of the Republican Party, the current Republican Speaker in the House and was the chairman of the Bush Cheney Campaign in the CNMI, he has decided to run for Governor under a local party banner (the Covenant Party) because the Republicans there nominated a liberal who also serves as the Resident Representative in DC for the CNMI, Juan Babauta. [I have copied a memo about Babauta which was presented internally to DeLay when former Sec of Interior Manny Lujan - now on Babauta's payroll - tried to get a meeting (unsuccessfully) for Babauta with DeLay.]

I just found out that Babauta is on his way to DC with his running mate and that they are being helped internally at Interior to secure a meeting with Secretary Norton. If this

meeting takes place, it will make it seem that Fitiaf has no DC clout and Babauta does, a critical matter in the campaign. Unwittingly, the Secretary will have given Babauta an incredible boost in his campaign by giving him a simple meeting, since Ben was denied such a meeting.

Is there any possible way to stop this from happening? It would be best, at this point, if the Secretary did not meet with him, or if she does, perhaps she could send a letter inviting Ben to meet with her as well, and then let him come in.

In any event, as you can see from the memo below, this guy is a bad guy, does not support the agenda of President Bush (in fact, I am not certain of this, but do not recall his even joining the Bush campaign out there!) or Secretary Norton. I hope we can stop this disaster. Thanks Italia.

Here is the memo noted above:

RE: Background on Juan Babauta

For years, Congressional Republicans and movement conservatives have led the effort to keep the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands a strong, independent commonwealth. They have ensured that the territory has moved away from welfare toward work. They have moved away from dependency to freedom. They have moved from socialism to economic liberty.

While conservatives have been bashed in the liberal media over their efforts to fight a federal takeover, the CNMI's own "Congressman," Mr. Juan Babauta has stood on the other side of these issues. Not only has he opposed these efforts, he has undercut the Congressional Republicans at every turn. Indeed, rather than supporting those efforts, Mr. Babauta has served as chief apologist for CNMI enemies Congressman George Miller and Senator Daniel Akaka.

Specifically, Mr. Babauta has:

- * Testified in support of increasing the CNMI's minimum wage. While conservatives have fought a principled fight to protect the local economy from a draconian minimum wage hike, Babauta supported applying the federal minimum wage to the CNMI.

- * Denounced House Republicans Efforts to Protect the CNMI. Babauta said that Democrats would win the House and efforts on behalf of Saipan would only anger leading Democrats. He has constantly publicly mused about the return to power of the Democrats in Congress, stating that Republican help would only lead to Democratic anger in the future. "We have to remember that Mr. Babauta was extremely critical of Governor Froilan Tenorio's decision to ... court American conservative Republicans. Mr. Babauta characterized it as an unwise partisan ploy which could backfire. And yet he may have been in bed with Akaka, David North [former Interior employee accused of illegal actions against Republican Congressmen and violation of other laws in pursuit of Clinton's aim to take over the CNMI immigration and minimum wage authorities] and the others all along." ("Mr. Babauta's about-face" Saipan Tribune, 01/24/00)

- * Proclaimed that George Miller is a "genuine champion of human rights." Despite the fact that Miller would double the minimum wage immediately and allow a takeover by the federal government, Babauta said that Miller was just misunderstood and was a "genuine champion of human rights."

- * Spent more time lobbying for the CNMI to have a non-voting delegate in Congress than fighting urgent minimum wage and federal immigration takeover threats. Even when Mr. Babauta testified before Congress, he did not use the opportunity to denounce takeover efforts. Instead, he admitted to "focusing" his testimony on the delegate bill [an attempt to raise his status in Washington from Resident Representative, with no office in the Congressional complex, to that of Delegate, like those of Guam, American Samoa, Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico]. According to the Saipan Tribune, "Mr. Babauta's federal takeover opposition is strongly suspect. It is a well known fact that Mr. Babauta used to be one of our critics. In the early 1990s, Mr. Babauta was an ardent champion of the federal minimum wage in the CNMI. He was highly critical of our local garment industry--about as critical as David North, Al Stayman [Clinton head of the OIA],

Danny Akaka, 20/20, Global Exchange, and George Miller (whom he once praised as a "genuine champion of human rights")."

* Contributed financially to re-election campaign of Senator Akaka, leading Senate opponent of CNMI. It is hard to understand why Mr. Babauta would have supported the campaign of such a long-standing foe of the CNMI. Moreover, it is impossible to determine how his relationship with Senator Akaka has benefited the CNMI.

On August 22, 1988, Congress enacted Public Law 100-411, appropriating funds in satisfaction of a negotiated settlement between the Coushatta Tribe and the United States Government. This agreement provided \$1,300,000.00 to the Tribe for the settlement of a dispute over the uncompensated taking by the United States of land owned or occupied by the Coushattas or their historical predecessors in the 19th Century. The Tribe was required to prepare a plan for the use and distribution of those funds and on February 8, 2000, BIA approved the Tribe's plan.

Under current law, BIA is required to publish notice within 30 days of approval in local papers of the right of persons to apply for these funds, which triggers a 90 day period for members to qualify to receive these funds. The Eastern Regional Office is responsible for this process but to date, the required notice has not been published.

Attempts over the past 20 months to move this process forward made by members of the Tribe, the Tribe's legal counsel, as well as members of the Louisiana Congressional Delegation, have been unsuccessful. All that remains to be done is

for BIA to have the appropriate notice published so that the 90 day period for receiving applications may begin, as per Public Law 100-411.

Enclosed please find a copy of correspondence from Franklin Keel, the former Director of the Eastern Region, dated February 8, 2000, approving the Tribe's plan. Should you need any additional information, please let us know.

But by far the new compact's most profound and threatening impact will be felt by the Coushatta tribe, which, for now, operates the state's largest casino just up the road in Kinder. Once the Jena cut them off at the Sabine, the Coushatta will go from dominating the market to struggling to hold on to a smaller piece of the action.

Here are two articles that were forwarded to me today. You can see from one that Ralph Reed and his firm are involved somehow. From what I have been told, Ralph is working with Doolittle (don't know whether for free or as a paid consultant), and has been bending the ear of Karl Rove and possibly even the President about land-in-trust and gaming issues:

I am also hearing that Ralph has involved James Dobson and Phyllis Schlafly with this. Supposedly, Dobson is planning to run ads and they mention Gale by name. He is anti-gambling and is incensed about land being set aside for gaming or that could potentially become the site of gaming. He has slammed Tom DeLay and is not known for his even temper.

I was also told that the Conservative Action Team (CATs) members have been asked to sign a letter to Gale and the President slamming DOI for the California and Louisiana situations. I was told they have congressional 50 signatures. I tried to verify this. I called Tom Tancredo (friend of Gale and mine and member of CATs) to ask him what he knew. He is in Turkey until Sunday night. You may be able to call someone you know to find out what they have heard.

At any rate, it looks like Doolittle is not giving up and that the conservatives are being mobilized. The email with Ralph Reed's name indicates that he is engaged somehow.

The Ysleta Del Sur Pueblo (Tiguas) faces a possible loss of significant land claim rights through circumstances beyond its control. Prompt intervention by the Department of the Interior would prevent this from happening. The circumstances arise from a matter of which you may be cognizant as the Chairperson of the Water Rights Working Group.

Current Situation: A stream adjudication for the Rio Grande River from Fort Quitman to the New Mexico state line is now before the Texas Natural Resources Commission. The United States Government, as title holder to the Ysleta del Sur Pueblo, is a party to this proceeding. Under Texas law, the Commission may decide matters collateral to the water rights, which in this case could and probably will include the land claim. The Commission's adjudication of the land claim would be prejudicial to the tribe's ultimately prevailing on its very strong land claim. The federal government has already attempted to stay the water rights adjudication unsuccessfully in a case that has gone up to the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals.

Ysleta del Sur Land Claim: Ysleta del Sur was founded in 1682 near El Paso. In 1751 the king of Spain made a grant to the Indians of Ysleta pueblo of one league of land, thirty six square miles. The grant was protected by the Spanish and Mexican governments and subsequently recognized by the State of Texas in the 1854 Ysleta Relief Act. After the Americans took over in 1848, land speculators stole much of the Tigua land from them. The State of Texas subsequently ignored the Tigua's Spanish land grant and title to the land. Much of present day El Paso is built on land taken from the Tigua.

The Albuquerque BIA office is looking at the land claim, but appears to be operating on the assumption that there is no urgency to come to a conclusion. We believe their preliminary assessment is very favorable.

The water rights issue is being handled by Chris Rich in the Salt Lake City DOI Solicitor's Office; he is preparing motions to contest the Commission's jurisdiction, but we question whether this will be effective given our perception that the Commission will find against Indians regardless of the issue. The Commission may well know the significance of what they are doing as it might apply to the land claim, which covers a significant portion of the City of El Paso.

Recommended Solution: The U.S. Government needs to institute federal court land claim litigation on behalf of the Tiguas as soon as possible. If the land claim were in the process of being adjudicated in federal court, there would be a stronger argument for that federal court to stay the proceedings in the Texas administrative stream/water rights proceeding pending the outcome of the land claim adjudication.

The Ysleta del Sur Pueblo was forced to close its casino because of legal proceedings instituted by the State of Texas to enforce a provision of federal law prohibiting gaming by the Pueblo, which provision the State had insisted on as a condition of federal recognition of the Pueblo. If the State now succeeds in prejudicing the Pueblo's land claim, the Pueblo will have been deprived on its last means of achieving economic independence.

MANSFIELD - The DeSoto Parish Police Jury and the town of Logansport have been given 30 days to comment on the proposed land acquisition request submitted by the Jena Band of Choctaws. If taken into trust, the land just outside of Logansport would be home to a Class III casino.

The U.S. Department of Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs Eastern Regional Office in Nashville, Tenn., sent letters to both government bodies via certified mail that were received Friday. In addition to asking for comments on the proposed acquisition, the letter also requests additional information on the possible impact of removing the property from the tax base.

The Police Jury in August approved a resolution of support for the land-based casino. It would serve as the initial reservation for the Jena Band of Choctaws, which now is based in Rapides, LaSalle and Grant parishes.

Police Jury President Dwayne Mitchell plans to draft the parish's response to the letter next week. "I'm not sure how we will respond, but

we will add more comments other than providing the additional information they requested."

The letter, signed by acting deputy regional director Howard Bemer, indicates the Police Jury will be notified of the decision to approve or deny the tribe's application, but it gives no date. Mitchell said he also has not been told when to expect an answer.

"But we're still positive about it," he added.

Likewise, the town of Logansport will issue its response, which Mayor Dennis Freeman expects to be brief. Freeman said the town has little to add since the property is located outside the corporate limits.

DeSoto Parish Tax Assessor Jimmy Stephens said the parish would lose \$189 annually in property taxes currently levied on the property. The 53.8 acres is owned by H.K. Stanley's Alexandria-based Machal Inc. Stanley was the financial backer in the Jena Choctaws' effort to put a \$300 million casino in Vinton. That application was denied in March.

Logansport officials already have shown their support for the project with a resolution. Freeman said he previously indicated the town's willingness to extend gas and sewer service to the site, which is about a mile east of the corporate limits.

It's also possible, Freeman said, the town would consider annexing the property between the corporate limits and proposed casino site. The reservation land itself cannot be annexed because once it is taken into trust it will become a sovereign nation.

"I would expect we would annex out to (state Highway)-191 because that would put us in a position to service the infrastructure on any other business development in that area," Freeman said. And while other DeSoto organizations also have noted their support for the casino, opposition is mounting among governmental bodies and organizations in the Shreveport-Bossier City area. The loss of local and state tax revenue often has been cited as the reason. Indian casinos are exempt from paying state and federal taxes, unlike the riverboat casinos.

WAYLAND -- There's another push to get the state to sign on to a controversial casino. A resolution will be introduced on Thursday in the House urging Governor Engler to reach a deal with the Gun Lake Band of Pottawatomi Indians, clearing the way for a casino in Wayland.

The same kind of resolution was debated in July 2001, but it lost by one vote. Lawmakers are expecting a similar battle this time around.

Some state lawmakers says time is running out to get a casino compact because so many are getting ready to leave office.

Representative Larry DeVuyst (R) is behind this resolution for a casino in Wayland and the one last year. But he thinks it's different this time around-the Gun Lake tribe is closer to getting the land declared an Indian Reservation.

DeVuyst thinks that will encourage more 'yes' votes but West Michigan Republicans point out it's still far from a done deal.

They defeated the resolution last time and intend to do so again.

We're going through and targeting each member of the house to find out whether their position has changed," Rep. Wayne Kuipers (R) told FOX 17 News.

Casino opponents believe they still have enough 'no' votes. But there is concern about the timing and there's also a question of who is behind this late push.

DeVuyst says the tribe approached him, but some have wondered if the Governor is also involved to make sure the state gets a share of the profits. Engler has ties to three businessmen investing in the casino.

"I have not talked directly with the Governor, but I do believe he has made a statement that we do need a compact now," DeVuyst says. "The fact I believe he's supporting this is encouragement."

A spokesperson for Engler told FOX 17 News she isn't aware of any push from the Governor on this issue.

The Gun Lake Tribe didn't want to comment on these new developments.

The casino will likely be up for a vote next week. A similar resolution was introduced in the Senate yesterday, but it will only be discussed there if it passes in the House on Thursday.

Interior Department to Extend Public Comment Period on Proposed Allegan County Casino
Public Comment Period will be Extended 45 days

WASHINGTON - Today officials from the Department of Interior's, Bureau of Indian Affairs contacted Congressman Pete Hoekstra to notify him that his request to extend the public comment period on the Gun Lake Tribe's proposed Environmental Assessment for a casino in Wayland Township in Allegan County would be extended for an additional 45 days.

An Interior Department official stated that a formal response to Hoekstra's December 12th letter, which requested the extension, would be provided before the Department publishes the notice in the Federal Register on either December 24 or December 26.

The Department originally provided for a 18-day public comment period that is due to expire on December 26. "Asking the community to comment on over 150 pages of technical data between Thanksgiving and Christmas was disappointing," said Hoekstra, R-Holland. "This proposal is very complex and controversial and the public deserves the right to have an appropriate amount of time to thoroughly review and comment on the impacts of a casino in West Michigan."

Wampanoag is the collective name of the indigenous people of southeastern Massachusetts and eastern Rhode Island. The current Wampanoag population consists of several tribes, who base their membership upon closely maintained kinship ties to the aboriginal communities. The two best known groups are those of Mashpee on Cape Cod and those of Gay Head (Aquinnah) on Martha's Vineyard, which is the only Wampanoag group recognized by the federal government. The Mashpee have never been recognized federally as they refused to give up certain rights as the Aquinnah did when they negotiated their recognition.

For 3 years, the Mashpee have been on the "ready to go active" list at Interior though they have been skipped over for consideration several times. The tribe sued and won the right to go on the active consideration list in the District Court and has prevailed through 4 appeals. Last June, the tribe was very near a decision when the Department of Interior received a stay. As a result, they are frozen until February when a Court will hear Interior's appeal. They are a reasonable tribe and have tried to negotiate to no avail. The tribe believes that a bureaucrat in the Solicitor General's office has unfairly held them up. I believe there is a history that dates back years. This is a legitimate tribe and has broad bi-partisan support in the state and at the Federal level.

The House-Senate Interior Appropriations Subcommittees have been ironing out their differences. We have \$3 million in the Omnibus for Tribal school construction program. This program would allow tribes that are willing and able to cost share 50% or more of their school to receive the remainder of the federal dollars to complete construction from the Feds ASAP, rather than waiting 10, 20, or 30 years for the government to complete construction. This provision 1) saves the government money; 2) builds tribal schools more quickly; and 3) allows willing and able tribes to contribute to their own infrastructure. Clearly, all are Republican goals.

we have several clients interested in using this money. In FY 03 (Omnibus), the Saginaw Chippewa (see attached letters); FY 04, The Mississippi Choctaw and Louisiana Coushatta. The Hopi Tribe of Arizona has also expressed an interest in using this money within the 5-year demonstration programs time frame.

Some appropriations clerks are fighting this saying there is "no interest. This is completely untrue (see attached letters). The Dem Staffer on Interior appropriations (Peter Keifhaber) is going to call Jim McDivitt DAS for Indian Affairs to see if there is a tribe that can use the "cost share" this year. He needs to be told to say "yes." He's received enough letters to indicate that (see attached). If he says 'no'he's lying. The other problem is Jeanette Hanna, over at BIA. She's trying to kill the cost share. She successfully knocked out the earmark last year and is actively trying to kill this language that MANY members -- House and Senate -- asked to be included in the final FY 03 bill, including Senate Chairman Conrad Burns and House Chairman Charlie Taylor. She needs to be dealt with.

Below is an email from our client, the Saginaw Chippewa Tribe in Michigan. As you can see, BIA is dragging it's feet with regard to the cost share program. If it wasn't for the Saginaw, the program wouldn't even exist and now the BIA needs to have a meeting to discuss the implications of the language because they don't think the Saginaw are eligible for the money because they currently don't operate a BIA school and/or are not on the school construction priority list.

Well, the language we included in the bill made no reference to either BIA control or the priority list. I know this because I wrote it. We also included a colloquy with Senator Stabenow and Senator Burns clarifying the Saginaw were responsible for this.

We're really going to need someone from the top down to tell Aurene Martin (who hasn't been hostile at all) that this money is going to the Saginaw, period. Your thoughts?

"Just spoke with Dr. Ken Ross at BIA New Mexico office. He indicated concerns he has over the school cost-share legislation, which he interprets no Tribes can receive the money if they were not on the September 1996 BIA schools list. Therefore, he does not believe the Tribe is eligible. Dr. Ross indicated that he is meeting with Aurene Martin and the BIA legal counsel next Tuesday to discuss the program. He wants to create criteria and had concerns about equity. Boyd Robinson of the same office indicated yesterday that he knows of other Tribes interested in the construction funds. Ross will not send any forms for the monies until after he obtains legal counsel from BIA."

Just spoke with Ken Ross at BIA, New Mexico. He indicated that the Interior Assistant Secretary will handle the issue and send a letter. However, Ross stated that Aurene Martin and her legal counsel shared concerns over the legal aspects. Ross stated this issue is in the hands of the Assistant Secretary.

The basic argument for Griles follows. In addition, three briefing papers are attached that should be sent along. The first provides a history of the Tribe's actions in federal court. The second highlights the Tribe's dealings with the Department of Interior. The third outlines the significant Tribe's history and the compelling reasons why the Mashpee should be federally recognized.

The Department of the Interior Should Suspend Their Appeal in Federal Court

The Department of the Interior should suspend their appeal in federal court. Procedurally, DOI's appeal is on shaky ground. The Department failed to file a timely or proper motion for reconsideration. First, the Department's January 9th "Motion for Reconsideration and For Leave to File Supporting Memorandum on January 15, 2002" was filed one day after the January 8th due date. The Department is attempting to claim that December 24th was a federal holiday, but precedence does not support this argument. In any event, even if it had been filed on the due date, the January 9th filing was insufficient to constitute a motion for reconsideration. Instead, the filing was a mere placeholder - declaring the Department's intent to seek reconsideration and stating that the grounds for seeking reconsideration would be subsequently filed. The January 9th filing thus did not constitute a valid motion for reconsideration, and can not toll the time to file an appeal. Therefore, it is likely that the Department's appeal will be ruled untimely and will be dismissed.

If the Department loses the appeal, District Court Judge James Robertson is poised to enforce compliance with his previous orders. This would likely mean that the Department would have fewer than 2 weeks to reach a decision on the Mashpee's federal recognition application. To avert this, the Mashpee are willing to provide the Department additional time to reach its decision provided a strict timeline is part of the settlement. This is the best scenario for all involved parties.

Hi Italia. I should not raise the following with Steve. There is a DOJ IG in Louisiana named Larry Gill. A few years ago, he showed up at Choctaw around the time of chief martin's re-election and started to infer that there was some proper basis of a corruption probe, which was used by the Chief's opponents. They lost and of course there was nothing, not even a real probe. Just a political fire drill because of this guy Gill. Now, it is election time again, and guess who is back? Larry Gill.

In the past, Gill set up in a local motel and at the country library. Then, Choctaws intent on disruptions sent fliers out intimating that the IG was here to investigate tribal wrongdoing. Last week, one of the candidates from the Pearl River Community notified Jim Clancy, Choctaw tribal AG, that Mr. Gill was once again in the area, "talking to people and taking complaints" about tribal employees who are "working at the Chief's campaign headquarters" on tribal time. Again, this seems totally politically motivated.

Worse, there is now a reason for the IG to focus on the Coushatta elections. Last week, someone broke into the tribal office and stole all paperwork related to the recall of our ally William Worfel. Hi, this is a heads-up to you both on a pretty important matter. The BIA, nationally, has rescinded all Special Law Enforcement Commissions for tribes, with no forewarning. These are the commissions which makes tribal police federally commissioned officers and, here at Choctaw, makes it possible for Choctaw officers to arrest non-Indians for federal crimes to include traffic and DUI violations. This means, because of some quirks in Mississippi law, that non-Indian DUI violators can not be arrested by either tribal or state law enforcement, even if death or injury occurs. Also, the assistant US attorney has advised that immediately the tribe can no longer use the federal magistrate system which has been established for the reservation. Apparently, there was no forewarning, just a letter to the tribes and there is no real substantive reason given. This has the potential for very serious law enforcement issues, given the beginning of the vacation season and the opening of the water park, beach, and Hard Rock, all of which will have lots of non-Indian visitors. PM has a draft letter to Secretary Norton which I will be faxing shortly to you. I expect that he will send the letter but he wanted to get you into the loop. Thanks
